Back in 1972, when John and Dow Didion established the Didion enterprise, they did so to help local farmers market their corn. Fifty years later, Didion Milling partners with over 500 Wisconsin producers, representing 140,000 acres of corn production.

In purchasing about 25 million bushels of corn each year, Didion injects upwards of \$150 million back into Wisconsin's agricultural community. And our partnerships go well past everyday transactions; our Grain Department, led by Micah Jensen and Garry Gard, creates daily market insights, develops educational materials, conducts educational meetings, and shares information about upcoming events so farmers can remain profitable, sustainable, and continuously have their finger on the pulse of the industry.

Didion is also proud to partner alongside a prominent customer in collecting and sharing data for a Regenerative Agriculture program. This vital initiative focuses on topsoil regeneration, increased biodiversity, water cycle improvements, enhanced ecosystem services and strengthening the health and vitality of farm soil. We work with Wisconsin farmers, as well as local soil and water organizations, to share data, strategies, and techniques for a more sustainable farming system.

Didion has a five-decade history of supporting community efforts large and small, making a robust impact on our community and civic partners. Since its inception, Didion has bolstered community efforts through corporate and staff-supported charitable giving. These include Kiwanis toy drives, American Red Cross blood donation drives, school athletics and education. and local food drives. among dozens of other important initiatives.

Didion started the Old Mill Foundation, led and informed by leaders in the community, in 2006 to focus on the most important local initiatives.

In 2020, Didion formed the Didion Milling Foundation, focused on **supporting programs** and initiatives that promote education and community safety in our backyard. To celebrate Didion's 50th anniversary, the Didion Milling Foundation recently awarded over \$100,000 to local law enforcement and fire departments, first responders, Habitat for Humanity and Future Farmers of America chapters.

You'd be hard-pressed to find an aisle in any American grocery store that doesn't have a Didion ingredient, like corn meal or corn flour, somewhere among the boxes, packets, cans and bags.

From standard recipes to custom blends, Didion produces ingredients for many of the country's most prestigious brands. We're in the snack aisle, the liquor department, frozen foods, the bread and baking section, condiments, cookies and crackers aisle and the pizza coolers.

Our reach extends beyond consumables. You'll find Didion products in dog food, cat litter, and even the charcoal briquettes you're using to fire up the grill!



The Didion Bioscience facility, co-located just across the street from the Mill in Cambria, opened in 2008 to address the need for more clean renewable fuel options. The idea then, as it is now, was to maximize the quality of corn product in Didion Milling's production process while providing valuable supply stream to the Alcohol facility.

Today, we're producing over 58 million gallons of this safe and environmentally-friendly renewable fuel each year enough to drive around Earth's equator about 5,200 times (of course, you'll need to stop at a few gas stations along the way).

Both plants, Mill and Bioscience, require a lot of energy to operate. That is why Didion is developing a long-term plan to lower our energy usage by 25%. As of 2016, we lowered our overall energy usage by 12%. Among the initiatives that will get us there:

- O Energy efficiency training
- O Helping producers conserve water, fuel, and fertilizer
- O Recycling water from the Bioscience facility
- O Purchasing corn from nearby producers to reduce fuel usage
- O Utilizing rail transportation to minimize truck fuel usage
- O Strong relationship with Focus on Energy, a statewide energy efficiency and renewable resource program

AROUND THE COUNTRY **Bioscience**

We all remember the early days of the COVID pandemic, running from store to store, pharmacy to pharmacy, trying to find hand sanitizer. There were even social media pages dedicated to sharing information about in-stock hand sanitizer.

In April 2020, when many of us were in lockdown, Didion engineered a plan to expand the capability of the **Bioscience** facility to produce 190- to 200-proof industrial grade alcohol to help ease the sanitizer shortage. We began producing alcohol in just 6 weeks and donated 1,850 gallons of hand sanitizer to 60 area organizations who needed hand sanitizer to keep people safe, including school districts, hospitals, and emergency services.

For nearly half its 50-year existence, Didion has partnered with the U.S. Department of Agriculture and USAID on the Food for Peace program, which provides nutritious meals to dozens of developing nations. In fact, in our earlier years, USAID was Didion's main business focus.

Didion makes products that are fortified, nutrient-rich meals developed in accordance with World Health Organization standards for at-risk populations. Our famine relief products provide over 240 million meals in over 40 nations, primarily in Africa and Central America.

David Silver, Didion Director of Finance & USDA Program Manager, traveled to Kenya with the North American Millers' Association to meet with leaders from the World Food Programme (WFP) and **USAID** to learn more about the demand for famine relief products in eastern Africa.

A drought, going into its fourth year, is impacting northern Kenya, southern Ethiopia, and Somalia where there is significant need for food aid. According to WFP, there are 500,000 refugees in Kenya hoping to get assistance due to the wide-spread drought, many of whom are receiving food through USAID. Didion is looking into opportunities for partnerships to expand and supply product to other countries in need of support.
